## ANCIENT NEAR EAST

- See also **Biblical Archaeology**
- The primary shelf addresses for the **Ancient Near East** are **BS** and **DS**.
- From the Library Catalogue search by keyword: Ancient Near East. The result is 110 plus hits or entries. From the Library Catalogue scroll down to Subject and key in **Palestine—Antiquities; Bible. Old Testament—Antiquities; Middle East—Antiquities; Egypt—Antiquities; Assyro-Babylonian religion; Middle East—Religion—Sources**.
- **SEE:** *Ancient Near Eastern Texts Relating to the Old Testament* (ref BS1180 A52 1971); *Ancient Near Eastern Themes in Biblical Theology* (BS535 N54 2008); *Dictionary of the Ancient Near East* (ref DS56 D53 2000); *Civilizations of the Ancient Near East*. 4 vols. in 2 (ref DS57 C547 2000); *Readings from the Ancient Near East* (ref BL1060 R42 2005 c. 1); *The Cambridge Ancient History*. - For electronic books, watch for an “eb” following the publishing or printing date of a book (e.g. ref DS62.2 L45 2002eb)
- For electronic journal articles search EBSCOHost (Request a sheet from a library staff member for searching instructions).
- For electronic theses and dissertations in TREN (Theological Exchange Network) see the Librarian for password access to the Digital Media Server and then search by topics or by truncated topics using an asterisk at the end of your truncated word. Search: **Ancient Near East; Egypt**. In the Simple Search box, key in your search word and the click on Search or press Enter.
- On the Library website, choose Web Resources from the main menu. Under History choose General History. Recommendations: Ancient History Sourcebook; The Archaeology Channel; Cuneiform Digital Library Initiative; Eternal Egypt; A WalkThrough Time – Ancient Calendars; Timeline of Art History.

## APOLOGETICS

- The primary shelf address area for Apologetics is **BT**.
- From the Library Catalogue scroll down to Subject and click it on to activate it for your search. Then key in the Subject: **Apologetics**. The search result will include more than 360 entries or hits.
- From the Library Catalogue scroll down to LC (Library of Congress) Call Number (the address for the resource) and click on to activate it. Then to maximize search results, do two searches. Search BT1102. It will result in over 65 hits. Then search BT 1102 (N.B. Space between the letters and number). It will result in more than 100 entries. Follow the same procedure for BT1103 and BT 1103. Together they will result in over 50 hits. Similarly, by searching BT1101 and BT 1101, together the search results should be 40 hits.
- For electronic books, watch for an “eb” following the publishing or printing date of a book (e.g. BS2825.53 W555 2015eb).
- For electronic journal articles search EBSCOHost (Request a sheet from a library staff member for searching instructions).
- For electronic theses and dissertations in TREN (Theological Exchange Network) see the Librarian for password access to the Digital Media Server and then search by topics or by truncated topics using an asterisk at the end of your truncated word (e.g. apologetic\* for apologetic, apologetics). In the Simple Search box, key in your search word and the click on Search or press Enter. The result is over 15 hits.

## ARMINIANISM AND CALVINISM

- The primary shelf address area for Arminianism and Calvinism is **BX**.
- From the Library Catalogue scroll down to Subject and click it on to activate it for your search. Then key in the Subject: **Arminius**. The result will be 3 entries or hits. Also, search by the Subject: **Arminianism**. The result will be 8 hits. See Arminius' chief work: *The Writings of James Arminius*. 3 vols. (BX6195A65 1956). Then in the Subject, key in **Calvin, Jean**. The result will be 45 plus hits. Under Keyword if you type **Calvin, John**, the result will be 30 plus hits. Type in **Calvinism**. **The result will be more than 30 entries**. See Calvin's chief work: *Calvin's Institutes* (BX9420 I65 1989).
- For electronic journal articles search EBSCOHost (Request a sheet from a library staff member for searching instructions).
- For electronic theses and dissertations in TREN (Theological Exchange Network) see the Librarian for password access to the Digital Media Server and then search by topics or by truncated topics using an asterisk at the end of your truncated word (e.g. Calvin\* for Calvin and Calvinism). In the Simple Search box, key in your search word and the click on Search or press Enter.
- On the Library website, choose Web Resources from the main menu. Under Religion there are five options: Biblical & Theological, Theological Resources, Church History, Church History - Creeds & Confessions and Religious Studies.

## BIBLE BIOGRAPHIES

- See also Bible Commentaries; Bible Dictionaries and Encyclopedias
- The primary shelf address for Bible Biographies is **BS**.
- Limit, narrow down or choose the Bible character who you wish to study
- **SEE:** *Who's Who in the Bible* (ref BS570 R43 1994 c. 1. Copy 2 is regular circulation under BS570 R43 1994); *Great People of the Bible and How They Lived* (ref BS571 G73 1974 c. 1. Copy 2 is in regular circulation under BS571 G73 1974); *Women in Sacred History* (ref BS575 S77 1990 c. 1. Copy 2 is in regular circulation under BS575 S77 1990).
- By browsing, see if the Biblical character or personality is under Bible biographies on the bookshelves in the Library under the Library of Congress Classification System under the shelf address of ref BS570-590 or BS570-590.
- As you browse the above range, see if you find a whole book or books by the name of that character or characters.
- If you cannot locate an entire book or books on the Bible personality, look for the name of the person or persons in collected Bible biographies. Examine the Table of Contents or Index of the book for a name or names
- Another option is look for the name or names in Bible Dictionaries or Bible Encyclopedias. These will be under the shelf address of refBS440 or BS440. Whether in Bible Dictionaries or Bible Encyclopedias, they will be under the same basic address.
- Be aware that for the most information on a given Bible character or characters, you will find more information under a multi-volume Bible Dictionary or Encyclopedia than you will under a single volume.
- For more information on Bible personalities, if there are Bibliographies at the end of articles use them.

- If you want a complete list of all the times that a name is used in the Bible, make use of an exhaustive concordance (See qui ref BS425, ref BS425 or BS425). A better option would be to use your cell phone and, for example, go to Bible Gateway, select the Bible version you wish to use and begin searching the Bible name or names.
- Go to Bible commentaries to be able to get more information in context about the Bible personalities who you wish to study. For Old Testament commentaries, see Genesis (BS1235 + extensions of .3/.53 etc.) to Malachi (BS1675 + extensions). For New Testament commentaries, See Matthew (BS2575 + extensions) to Revelation (BS2825 + extensions).
- For electronic books, watch for an “eb” following the publishing or printing date of a book (e.g. BS2825.53 W555 2015eb).
- For electronic journal articles search EBSCOHost (Login to Portal for I.D., Password, and instructions).
- For electronic theses and dissertations in TREN (Theological Exchange Network) see the Librarian for password access to the Digital Media Server and then search by topics or by truncated topics using an asterisk at the end of your truncated word (e.g. Pent\* for Pentecost, Pentecostal, Pentecostals, Pentecostalism). In the Simple Search box, key in your search word and the click on Search or press Enter.
- On Library website, choose Web Resources from the main menu. Under History, select Biographies.

## BIBLE COMMENTARIES

- See also **Bible Biographies; Bible Dictionaries and Encyclopedias**
- The primary shelf address is **BS**.
- Bible commentaries are in the Circulation and Reference areas—but mostly in the Circulation area.
- Bible commentaries are arranged mostly in Bible book order from Genesis to Revelation (From BS1232 to BS2825.54) and grouped together by Bible book.
- Also, Bible commentaries are arranged in order of Bible sets from Genesis to Revelation (BS491-491.5) or Pentateuch to Malachi (BS1151) and grouped by Bible publisher (e.g. Baker, Eerdmans, Zondervan).
- For electronic books, watch for an “eb” following the publishing or printing date of a book (e.g. BS1555.3 P54 2015eb *Daniel* [electronic resource]; BS2685.53 B78 2015eb *Galatians* [electronic resource])
- For electronic journal articles search EBSCOHost (Login to Portal for I.D., Password, and instructions).
- For electronic theses and dissertations in TREN (Theological Exchange Network) see the Librarian for password access to the Digital Media Server and then search by topics or by truncated topics using an asterisk at the end of your truncated word (e.g. Pent\* for Pentecost, Pentecostal, Pentecostals, Pentecostalism). In the Simple Search box, key in your search word and the click on Search or press Enter. You can search for theses and dissertations on Bible commentaries by entering keywords words into the search box (e.g. Psalms gives 12 results; Isaiah produces 12 results; Gospel, John yields 11 results; Ephesians gives 12 results; etc.)
- On Library website, choose Web Resources from the main menu. Under Web Resources choose: Directory of Web Resources. Under Directory of Web Resources choose: Religion. Under Religion choose: Biblical & Theological. Under Biblical & Theological choose (e.g. Websites: Bible Gateway; Interlinear Bible; Strong’s Concordance with Greek and Hebrew Lexicons; IV New Testament Commentaries).

## BIBLE DICTIONARIES AND BIBLE ENCYCLOPEDIAS

- See also **Bible Biographies; Bible Commentaries**
- The primary shelf address for Bible Biographies is **BS**.
- Typically, Dictionaries tend to be more defining and shorter than Encyclopedias. But Bible Dictionaries and Bible encyclopedias are under the same shelf address: BS440 or ref BS440
- From the Library Electronic Catalogue, search by LC (Library of Congress) Catalogue Number. Input: BS440. The result should show 98 entries. These will be either in the Circulation collection (The LC Catalogue Number is not preceded by ref) or ref proceeding the LC Catalogue Number.
- Keep in mind to search for Bible Dictionaries or Bible Encyclopedias that are multivolume. Logically, a multivolume work will have more content than a single volume one.
- Once you have physically located a Bible Dictionary or Bible Encyclopedia you can choose a Subject or Topic.
- Choose a Subject or Topic that you wish to research. Watch for Bibliographies following the Subject or Topic that you have located by searching the library database to see if the Library has any of these titles that you can use for further research information on your topic.
- For electronic books, watch for an “eb” (electronic book) or “oeb” (Oxford electronic book) following the publishing or printing date of a book (e.g. ref BS440 D496 2007eb *Dictionary of Biblical Criticism and Interpretation* [electronic resource]; ref BS440 O93 2011oeb *The Oxford Encyclopedia of the Books of the Bible* [electronic resource]).
- For electronic journal articles search EBSCOHost (Login to Portal for I.D., Password, and instructions) for another source of desired Subjects or Topics.
- For electronic theses and dissertations in TREN (Theological Exchange Network) see the Librarian for password access to the Digital Media Server and then search by subjects or topics or by truncated subjects or topics using an asterisk at the end of your truncated word (e.g. Pent\* for Pentecost, Pentecostal, Pentecostals, Pentecostalism). In the Simple Search box, key in your search word and then click on Search or press Enter. You can search for theses and dissertations on Bible commentaries by entering keywords into the search box.
- On Library website, choose Web Resources from the main menu. Under Web Resources choose: Directory of Web Resources. Under Directory of Web Resources choose: Religion. Under Religion choose: Biblical & Theological. Under Biblical & Theological choose (e.g. Websites: Nave’s Topical Bible; Interlinear Bible; Strong’s Concordance with Greek and Hebrew Lexicons.

## BIBLICAL ARCHAEOLOGY

- See also **Ancient Near East**
- The primary shelf address areas for Biblical Archaeology are **BM, BS, and DS**.
- For electronic theses and dissertations in TREN (Theological Exchange Network) see the Librarian for password access to the Digital Media Server and then search by topics or by truncated topics using an asterisk at the end of your truncated word (e.g. Pent\* for Pentecost, Pentecostal, Pentecostals, Pentecostalism).
- See also **APPENDIX I - Selected Resources for Biblical Archaeology** at the end of this document.

## CANADA, CANADIANS AND CANADIANA

- The primary shelf address for Canada, Canadians and Canadiana are **F** and **FC**.
- From the Library Catalogue search by Keyword: Canada, results in over 2,100 entries or hits; Canadians, results in 60 plus hits and Canadiana—2 hits; British Columbia, over 430 hits; Vancouver, more than 935 entries; Abbotsford—over 115 hits; Victoria—280 plus; Kelowna—50.
- From Keyword, scroll down to Subject. Under Subject, search: Canada, results in over 2,400 entries; Canadians—25 plus hits; British Columbia—over 790 hits; Vancouver—215 plus entries; Abbotsford—115 plus hits; Victoria—more than 50 hits. For other provinces and territories, search by Keyword: Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, Ontario, Quebec, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island, Newfoundland, Labrador, Yukon, Northwest Territories, Nunavut.

- For electronic journal articles search EBSCOHost (Request a sheet from a library staff member for searching instructions). For hardcopy periodical on display or on file, see *Canadian Teacher; Decision; Maclean's; Light Magazine; Reader's Digest*.
- For electronic theses and dissertations in TREN (Theological Exchange Network) see the Librarian for password access to the Digital Media Server and then search by topics (e.g. canad\*-40 plus results; Toronto\*--7 hits; Ontari\*--6 entries; Vancouver—5 results; Saskat\*--4 hits; British Columbia—3; Western Canad\*, Edmonton, Winnipeg, Manitoba with 2 each).
- On Library website, choose Web Resources from the main menu. Recommendations: Under General Works, choose Cookery. Choose The Food Network. Under Business, choose BBB: Better Business Bureau or ProFile Canada, features over 1,000,000 Canadian businesses. Under Leadership choose Canadian Journal of Educational Administration.

## CATHOLICS, CATHOLIC CHURCH, THE ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH AND CATHOLICISM

- The primary shelf address area for Catholics, Catholic Church, the Roman Catholic Church and Catholicism is **BX**.
- From the Library Catalogue scroll down to Subject and key in **Catholic Church**. The result is over 500 hits; **Catholics** has more than 30 entries; and **Catholicism** results in 15 hits.
- **SEE:** *The New Catholic Encyclopedia*. 18 vols. (ref BX841N44 1967)
- For electronic books, watch for an “eb” following the publishing or printing date of a book (e.g. BX1753 H632 2006eb; BX1795 S35 2009eb)
- For electronic journal articles search EBSCOHost (Request a sheet from a library staff member for searching instructions).
- For electronic theses and dissertations in TREN (Theological Exchange Network) see the Librarian for password access to the Digital Media Server and then search by topics or by truncated topics using an asterisk at the end of your truncated word (e.g. Catho\* for Catholic, Catholics, Catholic Church, Catholicism). In the Simple Search box, key in your search word and the click on Search or press Enter.
- On Library website, choose Web Resources from the main menu. Under Religion, select: Church History. Under Church History, select: Catholic Church History. Also, under Religion, select: Church History—Creeds. Under Church History—Creeds, see Ancient Era; Reformation Era;

Modern Era. Under Biblical & Theological, choose Theological Resources. Under Journals, see: Papal Encyclicals Online. Under websites see also: Catholic Encyclopedia.

## CHRISTIANETHICS

- See also **Philosophy**.
- The primary shelf address area for Christian Ethics is **BJ**.
- **SEE:** *Christian Ethics* (ref BJ1199 W47 1986; also, in Circulation with the same shelf address) and *Christian Ethics and Pastoral Theology* (ref BJ1199 N495 1997x; also, in Circulation with the same shelf address, except published in 1995).
- From the Library Catalogue scroll down to Subject and click it on to activate it for your search. Then key in the Subject: **Christian ethics**. The result is 345 entries or hits. By Subject, **Sexual ethics** results in over 90 hits; **Social ethics**—66 hits; **Medical ethics**—50 plus results; and **Business ethics**—40 entries.
- For electronic books, watch for an “eb” following the publishing or printing date of a book (e.g. BS2825.53 W555 2015eb).
- For electronic journal articles search EBSCOHost (Request a sheet from a library staff member for searching instructions).
- For electronic theses and dissertations in TREN (Theological Exchange Network) see the Librarian for password access to the Digital Media Server and then search and search by topics or by truncated topics using an asterisk at the end of your truncated word (e.g. Christian ethics; ethic\* for ethics and ethical). In the Simple Search box, key in your search word and the click on Search or press Enter.
- On Library website, choose Web Resources from the main menu. Under Humanities, select Philosophy. Under Philosophy, click on Philosophy – Ethics. Recommended: Christian Ethics Today.

## CHRISTIANITY

- See also **Missions** and **Religion**.
- The primary shelf address for Christianity is **BR**.
- From the Library Catalogue search by Keyword: Christianity. The result is over 1400 hits. Scroll down from Keyword to Subject and search: Christianity and culture—230 plus entries; Christianity and politics—150 hits; Christians—95 results. With over 5600 resources, this is the library’s collection and is classified by the subject of **Christian life**, including its extensions (BV4501-BV4501.3).
- **SEE:** *World Christian Encyclopedia*. 2<sup>nd</sup> ed. 2 vols. - For electronic journal articles search EBSCOHost (Request a sheet from a library staff member for searching instructions). For hardcopy periodicals on display or on file, see *Christianity Today* (On display. See also EBSCOHost and ATLA Serials); *Decision* (On display); *Faith Today* (On display).
- For electronic theses and dissertations in TREN (Theological Exchange Network) see the Librarian for password access to the Digital Media Server and then search by topics or by



truncated topics using an asterisk at the end of your truncated word (e.g. Christian\* for Christian, Christians, Christianity). In the Simple Search box, key in your search word and the click on Search or press Enter. The result is 320 plus hits.

- On Library website, choose Web Resources from the main menu. Choose Starting Places for Religious Studies.

- The shelf address for Church History ranges from BR129-1725.
- For Church History sets, see BR145.
- For *The Christians: Their First Two Thousand Years*. 12 vols., see BR162.3-BR479.

- From the Library Catalogue scroll down to Subject and key in **Church History**. The result is 800 plus entries or hits.
- For electronic books, watch for an “eb” following the publishing or printing date of a book (e.g. BR165 W43 2005eb; BR1725 A3 2009eb)
- For electronic journal articles search EBSCOHost (Request a sheet from a library staff member for searching instructions).
- For electronic theses and dissertations in TREN (Theological Exchange Network) see the Librarian for password access to the Digital Media Server and then search by topics or by truncated topics using an asterisk at the end of your truncated word (e.g. church history). In the Simple Search box, key in your search word and the click on Search or press Enter.
- On the Library website, choose Web Resources from the main menu. Select: Religion. Under Religion, choose Church History—General, Pentecostal History, Protestant History, Catholic Church History or Denominational Information and Archives. Alternatively, under Religion, select: Church History—Creeds & Confessions. Under Creeds & Confessions.

## FILMS, IMAGES, MOVIES AND MOTION PICTURES

- The primary shelf address for Film, Films, Movies and Motion Pictures is **PN**.
- From the Library Catalogue search by Keywords: **sound recording**. The result is over 1,900 entries or hits. Search: **film**, results in over 150 hits; search: **movie**, results in 40 plus hits; search: **digital**, results in over 30 entries; search: **DVD**, results in more than 30 hits; search: **motion picture**, results in 40 plus hits. From Keyword scroll down to Subject. Search: **motion picture**, results in 80 plus entries.
- For electronic books, watch for an “eb” following the publishing or printing date of a book (e.g. PN1995.5 N65 2009eb; BX8645 W67 2008eb)
- For electronic journal articles search EBSCOHost (Request a sheet from a library staff member for searching instructions).
- For electronic theses and dissertations in TREN (Theological Exchange Network) see the Librarian for password access to the Digital Media Server and then search by topics or by truncated topics using an asterisk at the end of your truncated word (e.g. **film\*** for film, film-

watching; **motion picture\*** for, motion picture, motion pictures; **movie; television**). In the Simple Search box, key in your search word and the click on Search or press Enter. The total number of hits were 10.

- On the Library website, choose Web Resources from the main menu. Under Fine Arts, choose Film & Images. Alternatively, under Important Resources, choose Internet Archive. Example Searches: Television, Archive, Podcasts, Select Feature Films, and Old Time Radio programs. Also, under Religion, choose Religious Studies. Recommendation: Journal of Religion and Film.
- Using Google, search You Tube. You Tube includes, You Tube Movies, Action Movies, Movies – Topic, Full Length Movies; the Best Free Movies on You Tube.

## GOOD ANDEVIL

- The primary shelf address areas for Good and Evil are **BJ** and **BT**.
- From the Library Catalogue scroll down to Subject and click it on to activate it for your search. Then key in the Subject: **Good and evil**. The result will be more than 120 entries or hits.
- From the Library Catalogue scroll down to LC (Library of Congress) Call Number (the address for the resource) and click on to activate it. Then to maximize search results, do two searches. Search BT160. It will result in more than 15 entries or hits. Then search BT 160 (N.B. The space between the letters and number). The result will be over 20 hits.
- Again, search by LC Call Number for BJ1401. The result will be more than 10 entries or hits. Then search by BJ 1401 (N.B. The insertion of a space between the letters and numbers). The result will be more than 15 more hits.
- For electronic books, watch for an “eb” following the publishing or printing date of a book (e.g. BS2825.53 W555 2015eb).
- For electronic journal articles search EBSCOHost (Request a sheet from a library staff member for searching instructions).
- For electronic theses and dissertations in TREN (Theological Exchange Network) see the Librarian for password access to the Digital Media Server and then search by topics or by truncated topics using an asterisk at the end of your truncated word (e.g. **good\*** for Good, Goodness). In the Simple Search box, key in your search word and the click on Search or press Enter. Results in 25 plus hits. Or search: Evil, results in over 10 hits. Search: **good and evil**, or: **good or evil**, results in four entries. Search: **theodicy**, results in three hits.

## JESUS CHRIST, CHRIST

- The primary shelf address areas for Jesus Christ are **BS** and **BT**.

The Title result will be Christianity Today (CT)—Now published under its abbreviated Title--; the Publisher will be Christianity Today, Inc.; the Location will be Main ser (In hardcopy display on the Library Main Level); the Date will be its publishing date, e.g. 20190301; and, the Vol. (Volume) will be 63 and the No. (Number) will be 2. (Hardcopy back issues for *Christianity Today* or CT will be in Storage on the Lower Library Level. For electronic journal articles of *Christianity Today*, search EBSCOHost (Request a sheet from a library staff member for searching instructions). Most Periodicals to which the Library subscribes (about 450 Titles) are located through EBSOHost.

Search by Subject: **Pastoral counseling**. The search results include over 300 hits. Search by Subject: **Marriage counseling**. Search results include 80 plus hits. **Counseling—Religious aspects—Christianity** produces 10 entries.
- For electronic books, watch for an “eb” following the publishing or printing date of a book (e.g. BS2825.53 W555 2015eb).
- For electronic journal articles search EBSCOHost (Request a sheet from a library staff member for searching instructions).

- For electronic theses and dissertations in TREN (Theological Exchange Network) see the Librarian for password access to the Digital Media Server and then search by topics or by truncated topics using an asterisk at the end of your truncated word (e.g. psycho\* for psychology and psychological; counsel\* for counsel, counseling, counselor). In the Simple Search box, key in your search word and the click on Search or press Enter.
- On the Library website, choose Web Resources from the main menu. Under the Psychology heading choose Psychology.

## RELIGION

- The primary shelf address areas for Religion range from **BL-BR**.
- **SEE:** *The Encyclopedia of Religion*. 16 vols. (ref BL31E46 1987); *Abingdon Dictionary of Living Religions* (qui ref BL31 A24 1981)
- From the Library Catalogue scroll down to Subject and click it on to activate it for your search. Then key in the Subject: **Religion—Dictionaries**. The result will be 4 entries or hits. Copy the shelf address of the titles you want and then locate them for use.
- For more specific world religions, Christianity is under the BR address. See: *World Christian Encyclopedia*. 2 vols. ref BR157 W67 2001. Islam is under the BP address. If you search the Library Catalogue under Subject: Islam, you will get more than 275 hits. See: *Encyclopedia of Islam and the Muslim World*. 2 vols. ref BP40 E525 2004. Buddhism is under the BQ address. If you search the Library Catalogue under Subject: Buddhism, you will get more than 55 entries or hits. If you search the Library Catalogue under Subject: Hinduism, you will get over 45 entries and for Sikhism, you will see 14 hits.
- For electronic books, watch for an “eb” following the publishing or printing date of a book (e.g. BS2825.53 W555 2015eb).
- For electronic journal articles search EBSCOHost (Request a sheet from a library staff member for searching instructions).

Searching by Subject: **Christianity and culture** results in over 235 hits. **Christian sociology** will produce

130 plus hits; or by **Sociology, Christian**, will generate more than 70 hits. **Religion and sociology** produce 35 entries. **Biblical sociology** or **Sociology, Biblical** produces more than 25 entries. **Canada—Social conditions** generates over 15 hits. **Canada—Religious life and customs** produce 10 plus entries.

- From the Library Catalogue, scroll past Keyword down to Subject search. Under Subject, key in **Suffering**. You should see more than 160 entries or hits. Browse the entries online to find what is suitable to you.
- If you want to narrow your search, under Subject, type in **Suffering—Religious aspects—Christianity**. You should see over 30 entries or hits.
- Another option under Subject search is to key in Pain. You should see over 125 entries or hits. To narrow your search, if you type in **Pain—Religious aspects—Christianity**, you will receive less than 10 hits

- The scroll up to Subject and click it on to activate your search. Type in **English language—Textbooks for foreign speakers**. The result will be 60 hits. Key in **English language—Grammar**. The result will be over 50 entries. Type in **English language—Idioms**. The outcome will be more than 10 hits. Key in **English language—Rhetoric—Problems**. The result will be at least 5 entries. **Textbooks for second language learners** and **English language—Spoken English** will each generate 5 entries.

- For electronic journal articles search EBSCOHost (Request a sheet from a library staff member for searching instructions). For hardcopy periodicals on display or on file, See: *Canadian Teacher* (On display); *CSE* (Christian School Education). On display; *Resound* (On display).
- For electronic theses and dissertations in TREN (Theological Exchange Network) see the Librarian for password access to the Digital Media Server and then search by topics or by truncated topics using an asterisk at the end of your truncated word (e.g. English language). In the Simple Search box, key in your search word and the click on Search or press Enter.
- On the Library website, choose Web Resources from the main menu. Choose Social Science. Click on **Education**. Under Education, choose **Education – English as a Second Language**.

## WORSHIP

- The shelf address for Worship ranges from BV5-25.
- **SEE:** *The Complete Library of Christian Worship* (ref BS680 W78 B53 1993); *Baker’s Worship Handbook* (ref BV25 B35 1998).
- From the Library Catalogue scroll down to Subject and key in **Worship**. The result is 325 entries or hits. By typing **Worship (Religious education)** will result in more than 15 entries or hits. By keying in **Worship—Biblical teaching** will result in at least 8 hits.
- For electronic books, watch for an “eb” following the publishing or printing date of a book (e.g. BS2825.53 W555 2015eb).
- For electronic journal articles search EBSCOHost (Request a sheet from a library staff member for searching instructions). For hardcopy journal on display see: *Worship Leader*.
- For electronic theses and dissertations in TREN (Theological Exchange Network) see the Librarian for password access to the Digital Media Server and then search by topics or by truncated topics using an asterisk at the end of your truncated word (e.g. worship\* for worship for worship, worshipping, worship leaders, worship directors). In the Simple Search box, key in your search word and the click on Search or press Enter.
